

## Call for Abstracts for Poster Presentation

### Abstract Themes

All evidence-based, best practices, best policies, and evaluation methodology research that highlights promising or proven solutions to reduce or end violence within local communities are welcomed. Research topics should focus on but not be limited to:

- community engagement approaches for living free of violence
- strategies for reducing risk factors associated with community violence
- mobilizing local communities for action against violence
- promoting physical and mental health parity in delivering health services that address the clinical and public health implications of violence across the life course
- educating communities on the concept of violence prevention and their role in developing solutions through community engagement

### Who Should Submit?

Abstract submission is open to all students, professionals, academicians, and community members who have **original work** in the field of community engagement for ending violence. Those eligible include but are not limited to:

- MSM Faculty
- Faculty from other Academic Institutions
- MSM GEBS, GEPH, and Undergraduate Medical Education Students
- MSM residents
- Allied health professionals
- Clinicians
- Community-based organizations
- Educators
- Public health practitioners
- Social Workers and Community Health Workers
- Local/state/federal government representatives and policy-makers

### Required Documents

Please submit the following:

- A short bio for the presenter. Students should include their school affiliation and their degree candidacy.
- An abstract of 300 words maximum. All abstract submissions should be sent to the following email address: [abstracts@chpmPublicHealthSummit.org](mailto:abstracts@chpmPublicHealthSummit.org). Email SUBJECT LINE: [Presenter Last Name\_ABSTRACT] e.g., SMITH\_ABSTRACT.

**Abstracts submitted after the deadline will not be considered.**

All abstracts should be limited to 250 words in length (not including titles or sub-headings).

Submission information must include all author names, degrees, and organizational affiliations.

The required subheadings are limited to: *Objective; Background; Methods; Results; Conclusion*. Authors whose research is accepted for presentation will receive notification along with information on set-up day and time, presentation days, and location of presentation boards by March 28, 2016.

**All authors invited to present during the poster session will be required to register for the Summit.**
